## **Remembering Saul Zaik, FAIA**



"He was not a rebel or someone outspoken on a mission, rather he was a sweet man with a passion for architecture and design. A designer who spoke and understood architecture, who taught and inspired many, especially his clients, his staff and his colleagues."

On January 4, Portland lost a great architect and a friend and mentor to many in our community. Saul Zaik passed away at the age of 93 in his home in Portland's West Hills.

A native Portlander, Zaik was a pioneer of the Northwest Modern style and the first architect from the Pacific Northwest inducted into AIA's College of Fellows. Friends and colleagues remember Zaik as dedicated to his work and generous with his time—he continued practicing architecture into his 90s, coming into work every day. Architecture columnist Brian Libby got to know Zaik well over the years. He writes that for Zaik, architecture "wasn't a job. It was the fun he got paid for."

Zaik is survived by his wife Chris, daughter Tracy Zaik-Hodgkins, son Peter Zaik, and granddaughters Haley and Isabelle Zaik-Hodgkins. A celebration of his life will be held later this spring.

Getting to LEED Zero Energy and LEED Zero Carbon Feb 25 | Details officials that would officially designate "classical" architecture as the preferred style of all U.S. federal courthouses. We have voiced our fervent opposition directly to the White House and officials in the relevant agencies. Additionally, all federal public buildings in the Capital region would be required to adhere to the same "classical" style (and all other federal public buildings whose costs exceed \$50 million in modern dollars). The AIA strongly and unequivocally opposes this change in policy to promote any one style of architecture over another for federal buildings across the country.
