CARES Act Programs

The CARES Act (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act) was signed into law on 3/27/2020. It includes employment protection and business financial assistance program. The AIA Oregon COVID-19 Resources page has been updated to include a CARES Act section and includes a variety of links.

The first link is to <u>Small Business Owner's Guide</u> prepared by the US Senate Committee on Small Business & Entrepreneurship because it is a concise summary of the relevant programs. The featured CARES Act programs includes:

- · Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loans
- · Small Business Debt Relief Program
- Economic Injury Disaster Loans & Emergency Economic Injury Grants

Today (April 2, 12:00pdt) AIA hosted a webinar covering the CARES bill. In addition to the programs listed above, the webinar covered:

- Employee Retention Tax for all businesses
- Emergency Relief and Taxpayer Protection Funds for Large Businesses

The webinar was located on AIAU and should be posted there on April 3. We will provide a link to the webinar presentation when available on our COVID-19 Resource/CARES Act page.

A significant program of the CARES Act is the Paycheck Protection Program Loans. While there is \$350 billion for this program, it is assumed the demand will exceed that amount, and those interested are encouraged to apply quickly.

Franklin Boulevard Transformation - Online Open House

Open Commentary will be available through April 13, 2020.

Planning for this project began in January 2019 with the goal to improve Franklin Boulevard from Alder Street to Interstate-5, including Garden Avenue. The project aims to transform Franklin Boulevard from an auto-focused state highway into a pleasant, multi-modal, urban corridor that is safe for all people, including those who walk, bike, roll, take the bus and drive.

Since then, staff has engaged with the community through multiple public involvement activities, including two workshops, online surveys and meetings with interested parties. Through public input and professional analysis, the three corridor alternatives that were shared in May 2019 have been evaluated and revised into one preferred alternative, which was shared at the Open House on March 10, 2020.
