UO Architecture Students win Solar Decathlon for the 2nd Year in a Row



For the second year in a row, a team of UO architecture students, led by Architecture Professor Ihab Elzeyadi, has won two international 2021 Solar Decathion Design Competition awards: the First-Place Gold Trophy in the Elementary School Division and the Grand Jury Award across all commercial divisions of the competition.

This year's winners, Team Riparian, were part of "High Performance Environments," a studio taught by Elzeyadi since 2007.

This is a monumental achievement and the first time in the competition's 20-year history to have an architectural team sweeping both awards two years in a row." said Elzeyadi, whose studio team, Team Polaris, also won both awards in 2020.

The U.S. Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon Design Competition recognizes projects that emphasize low-carbon, low-en and excellence in sustainable design.
