OSBAE Law Review Committee

Recommendations

In December of 2019, the Oregon State Board of Architect Examiners (OSBAB) established a Law Review Committee to evaluate the laws pertaining to architectural services as outlined in Chapter 67 tof the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS). The committee is tax set oreliev ORS of 1010 to 671 201 in the entirety and draft recommended updates to the statutory language. OSBAE's goal is develop a legislated concept for submitted to the governor for office for consideration during the 2023 legislative session. These statutes were last revised in 2013. revised in 2013.

AIA Oregon was represented on the committee by Curt Wilson, AIA, Eric Sandoval, AIA and Mark Jacobsen.

Over nine public meetings, the committee extensively reviewed and discussed the statutes and developed a revised version for the Board's assessment. The next step in the process is an active outreach campaign of stakeholders, including members of AIA Oregon.
