Portland Residential Infill Project - Free Lunch & Learns



June 10 and June 22 | 12-1pm

As you are probably aware, changes are coming that will allow more types of housing in Portland's neighborhoods. The Residential Infill Project will take effect August 1, 2021, and will allow additional accessory dwelling units (ADUs), duplexes, triplexes and fourplexes. The size of all structures will be limited in a new way to help additions and new buildings better fit in.

The City of Portland is offering two free virtual information sessions on the Residential Infill Project and how it will allow more types of housing in Portland's neighborhoods. Attend one of these Zoom sessions to answer these questions:

- How will the size of structures be measured?
- Where can I find more information?
- What are the changes to rules for development in single dwelling zones?

Springfield Public Hearing on the use of CDBG funds
June 9 | 5:30-6:30pm

The City of Springfield has been allocated \$366,652 in Community Development Block Grant coronavirus (CDBG-CV3) funds to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus (COVID-19). The City of Springfield's proposal for the use of CDBG-CV3 funds is currently available for review. A public comment period on the proposed allocation of funds is currently open and will close on June 9, 2021. A draft is available online [HERE](#).

On Wednesday, June 9, 2021, from 5:30 - 6:30pm, the Springfield Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC) will meet and hold a public hearing on the use of CDBG-CV3 funds. The CDAC will consider all written comments and oral testimony during the public hearing regarding the use of funds, and will make a recommendation to the Springfield City Council for allocation of CDBG-CV3 funds.
