

ARE Testing Sites Status

All Oregon Prometrix Sites Open Except for Medford

The Architect Registration Examination (ARE) is a six-division exam used to assess the knowledge and skills regarding the practice of architecture. Learn more about the ARE at the NCARB website. Each of the six exams are taken one at a time at testing sites operated by Prometric. There are six Prometric sites in Oregon:

Bend: 2150 NE Studio RD Suite 10

Eugene: 1500 Valley River Drive Suite 310

La Grande: 1901 Adams Ave

Medford: 101 South Bartlett St. SOU Higher Education Center Room 122

Portland: 1122 NE 122ND Ave, Suite A-107

Portland: 14623 SE. Mcloughlin Blvd

At the onset of the pandemic, Prometric closed all sites, but most were reopened in July, including all in Oregon. However, the site in Medford was recently closed again. Prometric expects to keep this site closed through the end of the year. The Prometric site in Medford is located at the Downtown Education Center that is operated jointly by Southern Oregon University and Rogue Community College and the closure appears to be related to the operation of these educational facilities.

The <u>AIA Oregon COVID 19 Resources</u> page includes a link to the NCARB announcement on the testing center status and a separate link to a message from Prometric on site openings and site closings. We will update the links as conditions change.

This situation is a result of the pandemic and the system implemented to license architects, which is based on series of coordinated activities by different groups, and none of them control the system. Each state's licensing board, including the Oregon State Board of Architect Examiners (OSBAE) relies on an exam system managed by NCARB, and NCARB relies on private contractors to host the exams. There is efficiency in the system, but lacks redundancy, so the system shuts down when a part of the system doesn't operate.
