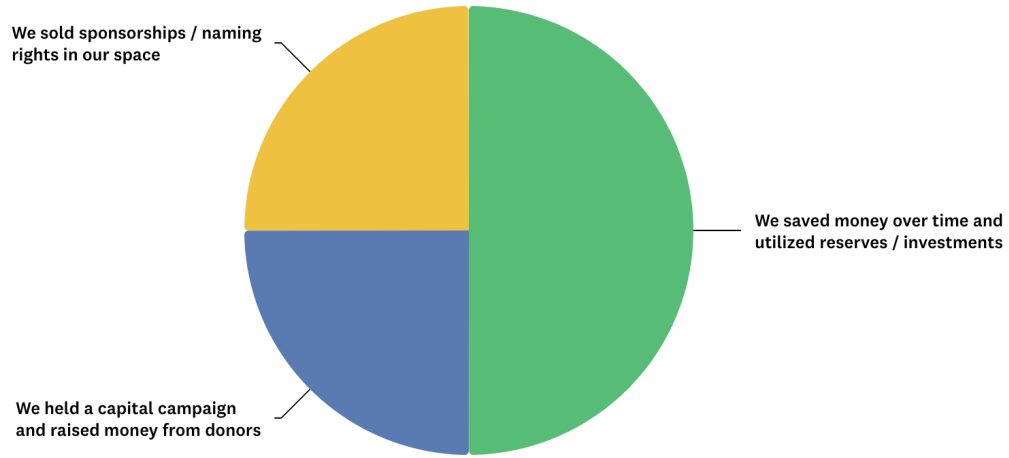
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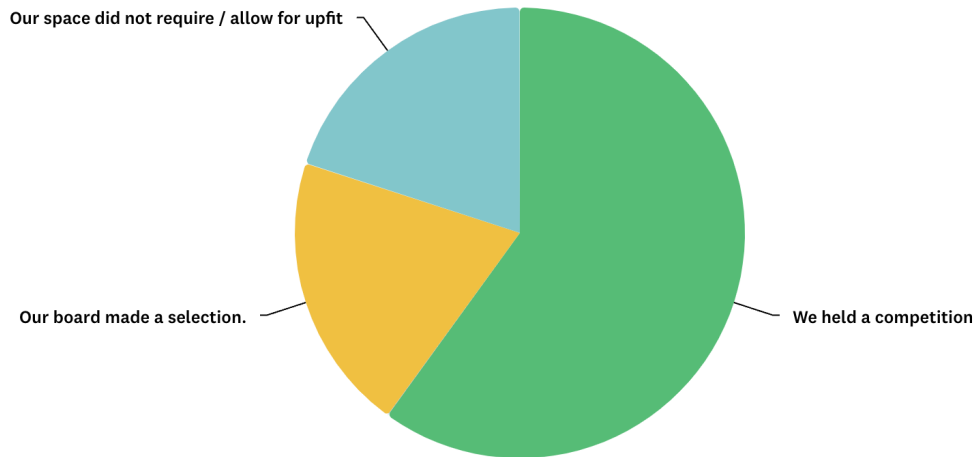
## How did your chapter prepare to finance your solution?

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## Are there any "big picture" items you feel should not be missed in an AIA facility discussion?

Your decision to move on from your space highlights many of the key questions - what do you want to do? your members want/need? What's the space of the future look like? We do not see many people coming back to our space that was very active before COVID - we are asking if their needs have changed.

Technology and hybrid offerings, especially when looking at serving members state-wide. In addition, with staff embracing work from home, going back into an office, has led us to want to find a shared space with other industry organizations so we don't have to be "present" all 5 days because in reality, unless it is a center open to the public, member events don't take up 40 hours a week and require the need to be physically present in the space.

You've seen our space, nearly 5,000 sf. It was a lot to sit empty for nearly two years.

Too often chapters decide they need a center and set off down that road without first understanding the resources it takes to run compelling public programming in a center, but I think you folks understand what that takes.

Consider how you want to utilize the space. We do a yearly member survey and while they love the 100+ virtual learning units, they want in person social mixers and tours. Our Board has been virtual for three years, so a conference room isn't necessary. We are meeting in person in March at one of the local colleges with an architectural program and a social event after the meeting to mingle with students.
